Tuesdays at Ten Summer Series

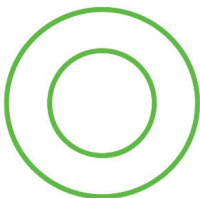

Book Giveaways

Staff gave out 22 children's books in the month of May to add to their growing home libraries.

DIY Kids

During the month of May, 46 kids attended DIY Kids and learned how to make various crafts including lava lamps, tech toys, 150th anniversary cupcake decorating, and clay and seed mosaics.

Club Fred

Last month, 49 kids attended Club Fred and participated in games and activities afterschool. Club Fred will continue to meet three times a week throughout summer break.

In May, 182 community members attended the various storytimes offered weekly including Baby, Toddler, and Pajama Storytime.

The Makerspace at Douglass Branch

Overview | January 2026–June 2026

Makerspace Drop-ins & Programming

From January through June, **86 community members** utilized the Makerspace Drop-ins which occur on the 1st and 3rd Saturdays of each month.

Programming in The Makerspace

Specialty programs related to Makerspace tools and equipment bring in 2–5 attendees per session. From January through June, **15 community members** participated in introductory sessions on Glowforge, Cricut, and the sewing machines.

Equipment Usage: Glowforge, 3D Printing, and Cricut Machines

Customer usage of equipment in The Makerspace continues to increase during the monthly drop-ins as more community member learn about the various creative tools available for general crafting and personalized design projects.



The Studio at the Library

Overview | January 2026–June 2026

Book-A-Librarian Appointments

From January to June, library staff met individually with **35 community members** people how to use new technology including the Glowforge laser cutter, Cricut machines, recording booths, video recording, sewing machines, and 3D printers.

New Equipment & Software

Final stages of staff training are underway for the new sublimation printer in The Studio. This enhancement will expand customer project options by enabling full-color image transfers onto items such as tote bags, complementing current Cricut vinyl, printable iron-on, and mug sublimation offerings.

Programming in The Studio

From January through June, **62 programs** were offered in The Studio with **1,391 community members** in attendance for regular programming including Crafty Adults, Writer's Workshop, Studio Workshops, and our Getting Started with Tech Series.

Continued Interest in The Studio

While Studio tools like the Cricut and sewing machines consistently generate the most interest, community members continue to request one-on-one appointments on the various tools, as well as guided tours of the space.
