New Storytimes, a Community Job Fair, and Collaborations with Unbooked



Friday Evening Hours at the Library Are Well Received

Friday evening hours returned to the Main Library on July 11. Adults have been excited to have events available on Friday evenings. Unbooked drew 109 attendees in its first month. Unbooked Kids offered a range of drop-in activities from Legos to crafts and saw 187 attendees in the first month noting that many families with children floated between Unbooked Kids and the new drop-in hours in The Studio throughout the evening.

United Way of Champaign County's Women United provide a \$4,000 literacy grant for Mother Goose on the Loose (MGOL)

This literacy grant will allow Mother Goose to provide books and programming to school-aged children who currently attend the MGOL partner locations, but who have outgrown the pre-school age range. This effort will support literacy development for school-aged children by providing age appropriate books to encourage building home libraries as well as engaging literacy activities during monthly visits.





Two Popular Four Part Series'

The July four part series on Appreciating Nature with Dr. Michael Jeffords (pictured left) drew a lot of interest and saw a total of 168 attendees. Also well attended throughout the month was Shannon McFarland's four part series From Insights to Impact (pictured right) with a total of 44 attendees participating in her workshop.

On July 12, we welcomed 586 community members to spend time in an indoor butterfly tent to observe live butterflies!

Oceans of Possibilities! Summer Reading Results

As of August 14, we've had 4,514 community members participate in the Oceans of Possibilities! Summer Reading Challenge. Library Staff design the challenge to engage all ages—participants have included 2,383 kids, 1,016 teens, and 1,115 adults. We estimate that 1 in 5 kids and teens in Champaign have had a chance to read and win prizes this summer. We've given away 4,939 prize books to young readers as a way to help build home libraries in our community.

We hosted DIY Kids activities with 88 participants exploring tech toys, building pool noodle creations, and constructing cup lighthouses, galaxy jars, and paper pinwheels last month. Club Fred saw 22 visits for kids ages 6-11 as excitement grows about access to the gaming and virtual reality stations in The Makerspace.
