




# **Award-Winning Authors and Aspiring Authors**


#### **Howl-o-ween Fun**

#### **Jam Sessions**


Last month's Friday Night Jam Session on October 24 brought in 53 participants who enjoyed a variety of performances including spoken word and instrumental pieces.
