

# **New & Noteworthy**



#### Great Author Visit, Celebrating Genome Day, and Growing Together

We are thrilled to host author Shelby Van Pelt as our next speaker in the Great Authors at the Library series (10/9). Her debut novel, *Remarkably Bright Creatures* (Ecco, 2022) was an Instant New York Times Bestseller and in 2023, she was awarded the Heartland Prize for Fiction and the McLaughlin-Esstman-Stearns First Novel Prize from The Writer's Center. Both locations will close at 5 pm to prepare. Doors will reopen at 6:30 pm exclusively at the Main Library for the event.

# **Program Highlights**

## "Ready, Set, Read!" Early Literacy Kits Provided for 340+ Kids and Families

Through an annual partnership with Champaign Unit 4 School District, we provide custom early literacy kits for students and families new to Head Start and Champaign Early Childhood Center. The kits are delivered during home visits by teachers before the start of the school year. Curated by our Children's librarians, the kits include items to support families' implementation of the five practices of early literacy: read, write, sing, talk, and play.

#### Teen Lounge Returns in Full Force

School was back in session in August and Teen Lounge has been seeing an average of 220 teens a day! It is great to have teens from area schools utilizing The Studio space after school.

#### The Library Helps Teachers as School Starts Back

During August, customers submitted 7 Teacher Requests, covering 9 topics, and selecting 134 items for teachers.

#### **Board Bootcamp Provided Non-profit Support to Community Members**
