

# Niche-cast


Community through choice

“Podcasts allow for an infinite range of topics and ideas. In broadcasting, there’s obviously a limit to what you can put on in a 24- hour period. And that means that there are gatekeepers who determine what is worthy of those time constraints. In podcasting, there are no constraints. You can focus on things that would probably never make it to terrestrial radio because terrestrial radio was and is designed to appeal to the greatest numbers of people listening at that given moment. That is the key difference between what podcasting does and what terrestrial broadcasting does.”

# Creating a Concept





Find Your  
Target Audience

List potential audiences as liking **most** of what you will cover, **some** of what you will cover, and **generalize** it even more.



Specializing  
Your Topic

What **specific** aspects of a topic will I cover? What will I say about this topic that **hasn't already been said**?



Adding to the  
Podcasting Space

What makes your podcast **unique**? What problems are you solving? Consider the listener's perspective, "**What's in it for me**?"



# Time + Money + Passion

## The Value Equation

### Learning Curves

If you're a DIY operation, nurture your premium assets of time and passion by thinking of ways to build in time for learning and to keep your passion/energy strong.

### Time Banks

Take your intended schedule and *increase it*. Hit pause and practice. Before you publish anything, finish several episodes for less sweat or publish less often.

### Change the Format

Consider shortening the length, getting a co-host, turn to your community, outsource the most time-intensive processes, or narrow your podcast scope.

# Think Like a Company

Understanding  
tasks through  
roles

## **Editor** The Taskmaster

Beats the podcast's structure and story into shape.

## **Producer** The Workhorse

Handles/oversees audio production, technical editing, sound design, mixing. May also edit, plus possibly many other tasks.

## **Host** The Brains n' Brawn

Creates (often) and delivers (always) the story.

## **Sound Designer** The Sound Master

Develops, obtains, and/or creates the sounds needed to make the story effective.

## **Mixer** The Minister of Detail

Fine-tunes audio quality.

## **Engineer** The Perfectionist

Does the final polish.

## **Composer** The Cleftomaniac

Writes original music or licenses existing music for podcast theme, and/or for individual episodes.

## **Art Designer** The Visualist

Creates the podcast artwork.

# Preproduction Example

1. Start conceiving your episode
2. Make interviewee/guest list
3. Research
4. Draft script/outline
5. Edit script/outline
6. Book interviews/guests
7. Pull clips to play during interview, if any
8. Send interview releases and permission requests
9. Prepare interview questions



# Production Example

1. Record interview(s)
2. Collect sound
3. Fact-check
4. Revise and finalize script or outline
5. Record your script or outline
6. Audio editing
7. Mixing



# Postproduction Example

1. Insert ads (if any)
2. Transcription
3. Write show notes
4. Prepublication promotion



# Publication Example

1. Publish episode
2. Promotion
3. Thank-yous with a link
4. Analyze and recoup

## Project Blueprint

### Overview

It's important to begin any storytelling project with intention. Before you start making things, you should have a clear sense of who you're trying to reach, what you're trying to say and the scope of your project on all platforms.

**This project blueprint is designed to help.** Fill it out at the beginning of the planning process when you have some idea about what you want to do. Once completed, it should serve as a "North Star" that will help you focus and prioritize throughout the creative process. Added bonus: It will also provide a framework for pitching your idea to other people.

#### INSTRUCTIONS

- 01 Read through the entire blueprint first.
- 02 When you're ready to dive in, gather some supplies (like sticky notes, markers and pens) and start answering the prompts. We suggest completing it in the order presented.
- 03 If you're stumped — or have a question/thought you want to come back to later — make sure to note it in the "parking lot" section on page 14.

#### ADVICE FOR USING THE BLUEPRINT

Consider this a take-home assignment that will never be graded. (A+ for everyone)

Use it to guide discussions with your mentor over the next few days.

You don't have to love your first answer to anything and you should feel free to make changes later (we have extra pages if you want to start over).

Use any materials you'd like, from sticky notes and markers to drawing directly on the worksheets.

# Make an Episode



## Record Segments

Tap the *Microphone* to begin recording

Tap *Stop* when finished

Add *flags* to the audio file for parts you want to revisit for editing

Give each segment a meaningful name

### Notes:

**\*\*Allow Anchor permission to record audio on this device\*\***

**\*\*Record up to 15 minutes in one segment\*\***

# Make an Episode

Add Background Music to Recorded Audio with Segment Options

Tap the "..." on any recorded audio segment


Tap *Add background music*


Browse categories or search for a specific piece

Tap *Play* to preview music

Tap *+* to add to segment

Tap "..." to add to Favorites





# Make an Episode

Edit Recorded Audio with Segment Options

Tap "..." to see *Audio Editing* options


Select *Trim Start/End Points* (iOS only) to clip out the beginning or end of a segment

Tap *Play* to listen to the clip in real-time while editing

**Long press and drag your finger** to select new start and end points

Tap *Save & Trim* to complete the edit

Tap *Reset* to return to previous Start and End points



# Make an Episode

Edit Recorded Audio with Segment Options

Tap "..." to see Editing options


Select **Edit Audio** to split recording  
(edit out a cough or pause, etc)

*Drag purple bars to desired spots  
then press and hold to delete the  
portion you don't want*

*Rename resulting segment(s) in  
Library and add to episode*

**Note:**

**\*\*Saved split segments can be found in the Library, then added to the episode\*\***



# Make an Episode

## Record with Friends

Tap *Invite Friends* to record live conversations with others.




Tap *Stop* when finished.

Add *flags* to the audio file for parts you want to revisit for editing.

Edit recording using "..." and Segment Options.

### Note:

**\*\*Up to 5 friends at once\*\***



# Make an Episode


Add Files from Library

Tap **Folder** icon to add previously recorded segments to an episode

Tap **Play** to preview Library segments

Tap **+** to add a Library segment to the episode

Tap **..."** to see Segment Options



# Make an Episode

Add Music from Spotify

Tap ***Spotify symbol*** to add songs via Spotify to episode

Tap ***Magnifying Glass*** to search for a specific artist or song or genre

Tap the + button to add the song to your podcast

**Notes:**

**\*\*Spotify has specific terms of use regarding songs, please check out their FAQ for more information\*\***

**\*\*Songs are not editable\*\***



# Make an Episode

## Add Voice Messages

Tap **Bubble with + sign** to add recorded voice messages to an episode


Tap *Play* to preview voice messages

Tap **+** to add a voice message to the episode

Tap **..."** to see Segment Options for voice messages

### Note:

- \*\*Anchor sends an email when a new voice message is available.\*\*
- \*\*Anyone can send a message via the podcast's page, if you toggle the button to "on" in your podcast settings\*\*
- \*\*Share voice message link with others for them to leave a message\*\*



# Make an Episode

## Add Interludes

Tap **Right facing arrow** to add interludes to an episode

Tap *Play* to preview an interlude

Use search to find specific interludes, or browse by genre


Tap **+** to add an interlude to the episode

Tap **..."** to add an interlude to your favorites

### Note:

**\*\*Interludes are not editable.\*\***

**\*\*Favorites will appear as top category\*\***



# Make an Episode

Add Sounds

Tap **Drum icon** to add Sounds to an episode

Tap *Play* to preview a sound

Use search to find specific sounds, or browse by genre

Tap **+** to add a sound to the episode


Tap **"..."** to add a sound to your favorites

**\*\*Favorites will appear as top category\*\***



# Make an Episode



## Import Files from Elsewhere

Tap **Import** to add previously recorded files from other applications to Anchor.

You can import files, interludes, background music, and sounds for use within an episode.




# Make an Episode

## Delete Segments

On Episode Builder screen:  
Tap "..." for any segment, then select  
***Delete from episode*** to remove a  
segment

On Library screen:  
Tap "..." for any segment, then select  
***Permanently Delete*** to delete  
segment from Anchor entirely

**Note:**  
**\*\*A warning will pop up in the Library if the segment is used in a draft episode\*\***



# Make an Episode

## Preview and Publish Episode

On Episode Builder Screen:  
Tap *Preview* to listen to your full episode.

Tap *Publish* to publish the episode to various platforms.\*


Follow Pop-up prompts:  
Give the episode a title, description, season number and episode number.

Upload custom cover art if desired (from photo library)

Publish now or schedule publish date

### Platforms:

- \*Spotify, Apple Podcasts, Breaker, Castbox, Google Podcasts, Overcast, Pocket Casts, RadioPublic




# Set Up Your Podcast

## Name and Description

Follow on screen prompts to set up your podcast. Review info later in *Profile* then *Podcast Settings*

Give your podcast a name, confirm the profile URL, then add a description.




# Set Up Your Podcast

## Cover Art

Follow on screen prompts to set up your podcast. Review info later in *Profile* then *Podcast Settings*

Choose cover art. Use Anchor's options or upload your own.



# Set Up Your Podcast


## Discoverability

Follow on screen prompts to set up your podcast. Review info later in *Profile* then *Podcast Settings*

Choose a category and language for your podcast. Anchor will use this information to place your podcast in searches for the category.

We're finishing your podcast setup

This will make your podcast available on all major platforms, including Spotify and Apple Podcasts.

# Distribute Your Podcast

## Publish Podcast & Distribute

Follow On screen prompts:

Tap *Publish my podcast* for Anchor to publish your podcast and make it discoverable to others through various platforms.

Find information about distribution of episodes and your podcast through your *Profile* and *Podcast Distribution* section.

### Note:

**\*\*It can take up to 10 days for some partner platforms to distribute the podcast.\*\***

**\*\*You need at least 1 published episode or trailer in order to publish and distribute your podcast\*\***
